Then they proceeded to walk next door from Holy Trinity church to the Thousand Oaks Healthcare center on Avenida de los Arboles. Inside the main entrance is a lounge with a TV and an aged man was slumped over half asleep. The Scouts sang a carol and moved counterclockwise down the hall to their second stop. I went back to the lounge, gently

placed my hand on the man's bony back and softly asked him "Would you like to listen to the Christmas carols being sung?" Surprisingly he replied 'Yes,' so I wheeled him down the hallway to the head of the Scout procession. We progressed halfway down the next hallway to the nurse's station where several residents had congregated and the Scouts sang another carol. As we went to the next junction, Elliot introduced himself to me and flawlessly recited the Scout Law. A little slow but who knows when he last recited it? As we again caught up with the Scouts the Scout Master, Bill Ackerman, knelt by Elliot's chair

and exchanged introductions. Elliot introduced himself; he was 88 years old, and he gave the Scout Sign and again recited the Scout Oath. Bill gathered the Scouts around and readied them to recite the Scout Law and I called out, "Sign's Up!" and everyone responded. They all followed Elliot's lead and it was a very tender moment for both me and Bill. Stopping at each corner to sing a carol, we progressed back to the main entrance.
