INTRODUCTION

The 2019 Conejo Valley District Camporee is an opportunity for Scouts BSA youth to demonstrate their scout skills and scout knowledge. It is meant to be both a competitive event and a fun learning opportunity. A "winning at all costs" attitude is discouraged and could result in a loss of points. As with all scouting activities, the Scout Oath, the Scout Law, and the Outdoor Code are the guidelines for behavior throughout the Camporee.

The Camporee is simply a group of Scouts BSA troops/patrols on an overnight camping trip that will involve organized competitions in which their scouting skills will be tested and judged. The judging will take place within 3 specific patrol categories: 1) New Scout Patrols, 2) Older Scout Patrols, and 3) Regular Scout Patrols, as follows:

- 1) **New Scout Patrols** consist entirely of "New Scouts" (i.e., scouts below 1st Class and < 13 years old). If even one scout is \geq 1st Class or \geq 13 years old then it is not a New Scout Patrol.
- 2) **Older Scout Patrols** consist of 50% or more "Older Scouts" (i.e., scouts who are \geq 14 years old or Life Scout or higher in rank).
- 3) **Regular Scout Patrols** are those that do not meet either of the above criteria.

These groupings are being made to ensure that scouts are competing, and comparing themselves, with scouts of similar age and degree of advancement. Ages and ranks used for patrol categories are determined as of the Friday of Camporee (April 26, 2019).

The Camporee theme for 2019 is "Catch the Spirit." All participants and event sponsors are encouraged to apply this theme throughout the weekend. Examples include patrol flags, cheers and menus, as well as campsite or event decorations. Special consideration will be given to those with theme spirit!

Camporee is intended to be "For scouts...By scouts" with adults supervising and assisting only as required. As such, Camporee is led by a Senior Patrol Leader who is selected from applicants. He or she is chosen to be a "Leader of Leaders." If your troop contains an enthusiastic scout of high caliber, Life Scout or above (Eagle and 16 years or older preferred), please submit their name and troop number to the Camporee Chair for consideration.

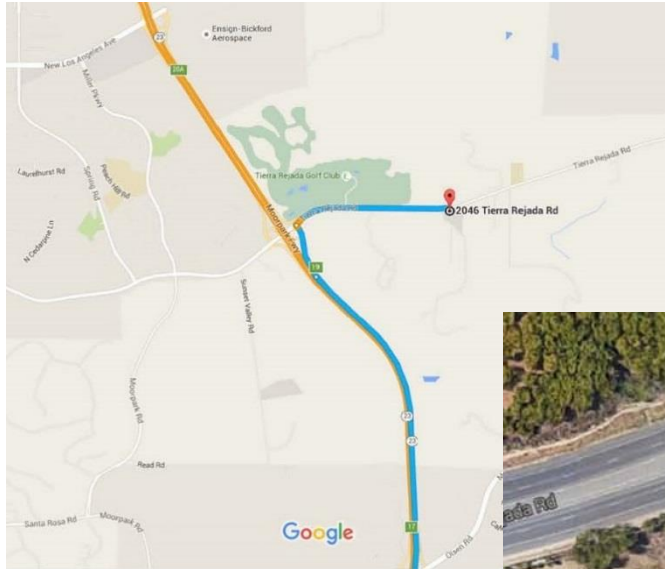

2019 CAMPOREE DATE & LOCATION

DATE: April 26 – 28, 2019 — Friday through Sunday.

LOCATION: Reagan View Ranch
Adjacent to 2046 Tierra Rejada Rd, Moorpark, CA 93021

DIRECTIONS: North on CA Hwy 23 toward Moorpark, exit at Tierra Rejada Rd and turn right (east) toward Simi Valley. Drive just under 1 mile to Reagan View Ranch on the right (south side). The property is just past (east of) Elegant Gardens Nursery.



REGISTRATION AND FEE

Register online at <https://vc.tentaroo.com>; log in to your unit's account, click on the Events icon on the left and select "Conejo Valley Camporee" from the list of events. Click on CV "Catch the Spirt" District Camporee and register/pay for the number of youth and adults from your troop that will be attending Camporee.

To encourage early registration, Camporee fees are discounted to **\$22 per person through Friday, March 22, 2019**. After that date, the fee increases to **\$32 per person** and the **final registration deadline is Saturday, April 20, 2019**.

Following initial registration, units are encouraged to add additional youth or adult participants prior to Camporee using the online registration site. Any additional registrants will be charged the fee applicable at the time of the supplemental registration. **Initial Troop registration is NOT allowed at check-in on the Friday of Camporee**, although minor additions of youth or adults can be made at that time.

There will be **no refunds** of paid Camporee fees after the early-bird registration deadline (March 22, 2019).

While no registration forms are required due to the online process, please note that **units are still required to bring two copies of a completed Camporee Unit Roster at CHECK-IN**. This form and other useful information is available on the [CVD Camporee website](#).

SITE WORK DAY PRIOR TO CAMPOREE – APRIL 6, 2019

A work day has been planned for April 6, 2019 (8:00 AM to 12:00 Noon) to make minor improvements and otherwise get the site ready for Camporee. The Camporee Committee is requesting that all units planning to attend Camporee, as well as the Moskimos Chapter of the Order of the Arrow (OA), please send at least a small contingent of youth and adults to help out. Helpers should bring work gloves and drinking water and wear appropriate work clothes. Tools will be provided, although it will be helpful if workers could bring gas-powered line trimmers and/or hoes to help clear the campfire amphitheater area.

GEAR DROP-OFF PRIOR TO CAMPOREE

The scheduled time for vehicle access to the camping area for gear drop-off is Friday, April 26th from 8:00 AM until 3:30 PM. No vehicles will be permitted to enter the camping area after 3:30 PM. If you cannot drop off gear prior to this time, all gear will have to be carried into the camping area by hand or on carts/dollies. Note that the main parking area at the site is adjacent to the camping area. If you cannot make the Friday gear drop-off, or would prefer to drop gear Thursday evening **AND** you have an enclosed, locked trailer, you may drop the trailer off between 5:00 PM and 7:00 PM on Thursday, April 19th. **Note: there is no security at the site and you will assume all risks for loss or damage**. One trailer per unit (minus the towing vehicle) may be parked along the east perimeter of the camping area (along the wooden fence).

ARRIVAL AND PARKING

IMPORTANT: E-mail updates may be distributed with last minute parking information.

Parking at the site is limited. Because of this, it is highly encouraged for units to use drivers who are not camping overnight for drop-off and pick-up, in order to conserve parking. No RV's (motorhomes, trailers or campers) are allowed.

Scouts may be dropped off near the marked staging area for Camporee check-in. Gear must be carried to the campsite **AFTER** check in and inspection. **DO NOT ATTEMPT TO CARRY GEAR TO THE SITE BEFORE YOU CHECK IN. Patrols should remember to bring the relevant gear to the check-in area so they can pass inspection.**

Driving lanes through the parking area will be marked, and must be kept clear for through traffic. All drivers and passengers must move to the marked staging area immediately after each vehicle is parked. Do not wait in the parking area for all of your troop vehicles to arrive; this

becomes a safety hazard for those waiting and for approaching vehicles, as well as for parking staff. The parking staff will direct all units to the staging area near the check-in area so as to keep traffic flowing. Camporee staff will direct units to check-in and uniform/equipment inspection areas. Adherence to these instructions is absolutely mandatory.

VEHICLE CONTROL

All vehicles must park in the designated parking area. This includes Friday evening through the close of the event Sunday morning. During Camporee, no vehicles will be permitted in the camping or event areas without prior authorization. **On Sunday morning, only trailer-towing vehicles will be allowed into the camping area, and only after 8:30 AM** (i.e., during or after the morning assembly). Vehicles hooking up to a trailer during the morning assembly must remain at the campsite until the unit departs, as there will be no place else to park the double length vehicle. **Please respect quiet hours and foot traffic by NOT attempting to enter the camping area before 8:30 AM.**

CHECK-IN

Check-in is between 4:30 PM and 6:30 PM on Friday, April 26th. Please plan to have your unit arrive in one group. This means that your **whole troop** should arrive for check-in at the same time. The gathering and check-in areas will be identified and staff will be available to direct you.

Only the Scoutmaster and SPL should go to the check-in area and they **must** have:

Camporee Unit Rosters – Completed Adult and Youth Rosters (**2 copies each**) with:

1) names/positions of adults; 2) patrol names; 3) name, age and rank for each youth in each patrol.

Payment (if needed) – For any additional adults or youth not already paid (i.e., \$32 each, in cash or check)

Parental Permission/Consent-to-Treat Forms – One for each youth attending Camporee.

Fire Extinguisher – One required per unit, whether or not you are planning to have a fire at your campsite. This is a required part of our site safety plan.

A campsite and event location map will be provided at check-in, along with a check-out form and unit evaluation forms.

UNIFORM INSPECTION

Each scout must arrive in complete field (“Class A”) uniform. After check-in, each patrol will proceed to the uniform inspection area – See [2019 CAMPOREE INSPECTION INSTRUCTIONS](#). After the inspection, uniform shirts can be removed and appropriate scout activity shirts may be worn if so desired.

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT

Remember the Outdoor Code. To lessen our impact on the environment, everyone needs to do their part to protect the fragile structure of this site by carefully observing low impact camping concepts. No tree climbing. Please use only biodegradable soap and dispose of “grey” water away from the drainage creek. Wastewater holes should be very few in number, limited to water only (no food scraps) and to 12 inches deep and 6 inches wide. They must be completely filled in and compacted after use. Food scraps must be disposed of with your garbage (i.e., “Pack it in, Pack it out.”) so as not to attract wild animals to buried food scraps. The area near water spigots is to be used only to fill containers, which must be carried back to your assigned site before using the water. To prevent mud puddles, **NO dish-washing and NO bathing, drinking, or hand-washing will be allowed around the water spigots.**

POTABLE WATER

Potable water will be available at water spigots in various locations. Please do not waste water. Carry all required water to your campsite and use it there.

SHADE

There is very limited shade at the site and no shade in the camping or event areas. Units are encouraged to bring canopies, tarps, etc. to provide shade in both their campsite and their event area.

FIRES

A fire permit is being secured for the event and we plan to allow open fires at unit campsites, weather conditions permitting. However, all fires must be in **elevated fire pits** and appropriate precautions taken, including adult supervision. **Each unit MUST have a fire extinguisher (ABC type) in their campsite.** Excessively large fires are prohibited – they must be reduced or put out. Charcoal may also be used, provided it's in a grill or other container raised off the ground. Ashes from fires/charcoal must be removed by your unit. Do not scatter ashes on the site or dump into the trash. **All fires must be extinguished COLD OUT before retiring for the night.** Do not add wood to fires after taps (lights out) at 10:30 PM.

IMPORTANT: Last minute e-mail updates may be distributed regarding fire restrictions.

STOVES

No liquid fuel stoves or lanterns. White gas, alcohol, kerosene, etc. are not to be used. Only stoves and lanterns using sealed-valve containers, such as propane or isobutane/propane mix, are to be used, and only in the campsite under adult supervision.

FIRST AID

There is a First Aid Station available, staffed by licensed and/or certified personnel. All injuries must be reported to this station to comply with insurance requirements.

SANITATION

Portable toilets will be available for everyone to use. Observe any special restrictions (e.g., Handicapped, Female, Adults Only) if they are identified. Please help us to keep the toilets and the nearby wash stations clean.

There will be limited trash disposal available at the site, so units are encouraged to “Pack-it-in, Pack-it-out” for their rubbish. Do not place large items, such as broken equipment (chairs, canopies, etc.) in the trash dumpsters – Pack it out! If the dumpsters are full, do not stack more trash on top – Pack it out! Do not dispose of trash in the portable toilets! Do not dump trash on the ground! Wastewater must be disposed in a safe and environmentally friendly manner (see [ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT](#) above). **All food should be properly stowed to avoid attracting animals.**

SAFETY

No firearms, sheath knives, butterfly knives, or knives with blades over 3 inches long are allowed for scouts or adults. Please observe any roped-off areas, and other areas identified by signs or Camporee Staff as **OFF LIMITS**. For example, shooting/throwing events present a hazard to pedestrians and will require appropriate restricted areas. **Please notify your scouts and adults that the road up to Elegant Gardens Nursery is CLOSED due to its proximity to archery and tomahawk events. No scouts or adults are permitted to cross the fences into adjacent properties or enter the Elegant Gardens Nursery property up the hill to the west.**

FLAGS

Unit flags are to remain in the unit's campsite area. Patrols should carry their patrol flag during events.

AWARDS

- Event awards will be presented for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place for each patrol category (Decathlon events only). These awards will be presented at the campfire on Saturday night.
- Awards will also be presented for Gateway, Patrol Flag, and Dutch Oven competitions.
- 1st, 2nd and 3rd place awards will be presented to patrols for the skit/song competition during the Sunday morning assembly. ***See the separate flyer regarding the skit/song competition.***
- A Camporee participation ribbon (Camporee Award, Award of Merit, and Award of Merit and Honor) will be presented at the Sunday morning assembly to each patrol based on Uniform Inspection, Equipment Inspection, Campsite Inspection, and Decathlon event scores (i.e., total points).
- Also at the Sunday morning assembly, Decathlon ribbons based on total points will be presented to the 1st, 2nd and 3rd place patrols from each category. All participating members of 1st place Decathlon patrols will also receive a medal.
- Scout Spirit Awards will be given to the patrol in each category with the highest total Spirit points achieved during inspections and events.

SCOUT SPIRIT

Camporee participants are expected to display Scout Spirit throughout Camporee. The essence of Scout Spirit is found in the Scout Oath & Law, the Scout Motto & Slogan, and the Outdoor Code. Scout Spirit exhibited by each patrol will be evaluated throughout Camporee by the Commissioners and Event Staff, resulting in a Spirit Award to the patrol in each category (i.e., New Scouts, Regular, and Older Scouts) that best exemplifies Scout Spirit throughout the weekend. Scout Spirit that recognizes and participates in the Camporee theme (“Catch the Spirit”) will be given special consideration.

During the events on Saturday, Scout Spirit will be scored on a scale of 0 to 5 at each event. While Spirit scoring is at the discretion of the sponsor for each event, consideration is typically given to the following:

1. Patrol flag present
2. Patrol yell is understandable and “loud & proud”
3. Patrol Leader actually leads the patrol
4. Participation by all patrol members (even if just encouraging others)
5. Courtesy toward the event staff and each other
6. Matching, scout-related Class B attire.

ELECTRONIC GAMES, RADIOS, DRONES, ETC.

Flashlights, watches, alarm clocks, and GPS receivers are allowed. All other electronic devices are discouraged and, in extreme cases, may be confiscated and returned at check-out. This includes portable music and game players. Cellphones should be left with adult leaders for emergency use only. Drones and other radio-controlled aircraft are not allowed unless authorized by the Camporee Chair.

PETS

No animals are allowed.

ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES/CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES

It is the policy of the Boy Scouts of America that the use of alcoholic beverages and controlled substances (including smoking) is not permitted at encampments or activities on property owned and/or operated by the Boy Scouts of America, or at any activity involving participation of youth members.

UNSCHEDULED ARRIVALS/DEPARTURES

Anyone arriving at or departing from Camporee at any time during the course of the weekend **MUST** sign in and out at the **First Aid Station**. We need to be aware of any change in attendance for all adults and scouts at Camporee in the event of an emergency.

LOST AND FOUND

Items found are to be turned in at the **First Aid Station**. Lost items may be claimed at the First Aid Station. (Hint: Label all of your belongings!)

CAMPOREE STAFF AND ADULT MEALS

Staff and adult meals are planned to be available for purchase for Saturday breakfast, lunch and dinner, and Sunday breakfast. All staff and adults attending Camporee are welcome to participate. Meals must be ordered prior to Camporee. See the [Camporee website](#) for information and order forms.

ORDER OF THE ARROW (OA)

Each unit should schedule OA elections during a unit meeting prior to Camporee. There is planned to be an OA call-out at the Saturday evening campfire. Contact Peter Bowen for details (peter@bowenfamily.org; 805-216-9743).

CAMPOREE DRESS CODE

Class A uniforms are required at all assemblies including Saturday & Sunday morning and Saturday evening campfire/awards. Unit Class B or other scouting t-shirt or attire is preferred during Saturday's competition and spirit points may be added to those patrols with matching scout attire. Members of the Order of the Arrow are encouraged to wear their sash to Saturday evening campfire, which includes OA call-out.

WEBELOS VISITATION

Webelos dens are invited to visit Camporee on Saturday so they can see what Scouts BSA is all about. It is suggested that they wear their uniform and visit in the afternoon - the climbing wall and other "fun events" will be available for their use. Participation in Decathlon events is restricted to Scouts BSA patrols only. Please have your Webelos Den Chiefs encourage their dens to join us, and please make our guests feel welcome!

CHECK-OUT

Check-out time is after Sunday morning assembly/awards or, for LDS units, during Saturday dinner (**LDS units are, however, encouraged to stay for the Saturday evening Campfire**). A Unit Commissioner must inspect all campsites **before** the site can be vacated. Camporee patches will be distributed after inspection and completion of the evaluation form – return the completed forms to the First Aid Station to collect your patches.

In view of this, adult involvement in the scout activities (including but not limited to setting up camp, preparing meals, coaching or competing during events, and organizing patrol activities) should be limited to safety oversight.</p>

2019 CAMPOREE INSPECTION INSTRUCTIONS

CHECK-IN, UNIFORM AND EQUIPMENT INSPECTIONS (Friday 4:30 PM - 6:30 PM)

INTRODUCTION

When each troop arrives (whether on foot or in vehicles) they will gather and wait in the staging area near the check-in table until directed by Camporee Staff. - **DO NOT GO TO YOUR CAMPSITE UNTIL YOUR TROOP IS CHECKED IN AND PATROLS HAVE COMPLETED INSPECTION.**

- From the designated staging area, the **SM and SPL only** will proceed to the check-in area with the appropriate paperwork.
- After the check-in is completed, the troop/patrol will proceed to the inspection area for uniform and equipment inspection. Inspections will be made at the patrol level.
- After check-in and inspection, the troop/patrol may proceed to its camping area.

SCOUT UNIFORM INSPECTION ITEMS

1. Uniform shirt (new or old style) is worn, tucked in and is clean
2. Correct unit number on shirt
3. Ventura County Council patch on shirt (patch from another council OK for visitor).
4. Correct rank in proper position on shirt (PL verifies correct rank)
5. Patrol patch in correct position on shirt
6. Neckerchief worn (should be troop's, but could be any Scouts BSA neckerchief; shirt collar may be out or tucked in, but the same for all patrol members)
7. Uniform pants/shorts (new or old style) worn
8. Uniform/BSA belt worn properly
9. Clean shoes/boots and socks worn (any recognizable BSA socks are OK); Camporee requires a "complete" dress uniform which includes BSA socks.
10. Overall neatness

Notes:

- ◆ Hats are not required. However, if one scout is wearing a hat, then all must wear the same kind of hat, which **MUST** be scout related. Hats may be removed for inspection.
- ◆ Only the most recent quality unit patch should be worn; but **NO** points off.

Scoring criteria: If all scouts in the patrol are wearing clean uniform shirts, then the full 10 points are awarded for that item. If one scout is not wearing the uniform shirt or if a shirt is excessively dirty/not tucked in, then 5 points are awarded to the patrol. If more than half of the patrol are not wearing the uniform shirt, tucked in, or are wearing excessively dirty shirts, the patrol is awarded 0 points. The same criteria are used for inspection items 2-10.

PATROL EQUIPMENT INSPECTION ITEMS

The following items are worth 10 points each. Except for item # 7, the equipment items may be carried by any one member of the patrol.

1. Patrol Leader (PL) has PL patch in correct position on his shirt
2. Assistant PL (APL) has APL patch in correct position on his shirt
3. Patrol First Aid Kit (must be presented within 1 minute of being asked to produce it)
4. Compass
5. Patrol flag
6. Scout handbook
7. **Each scout will present his/her Totin' Chip (card or patch)**
8. Notebook
9. Pencil or pen
10. Flashlight

2019 CAMPOREE INSPECTION INSTRUCTIONS (cont'd)

SATURDAY CAMPSITE INSPECTIONS (AFTER BREAKFAST AND FLAG CEREMONY)

(Approximately 9:00 – 11:00 AM)

CAMPSITE INSPECTION

1. Scout craft (verify there is at least one; it doesn't matter what it is).
2. Camp improvement(s) is/are in place (e.g., gateway, roped-off areas) (verify existence only). Note: troop gateway counts for every patrol in the troop.
3. Patrol names visibly posted in patrol's kitchen area.
4. Duty roster and menu(s) visibly posted (preferably in kitchen area).
5. First-aid kit visible, readily available and marked as a first-aid kit.
6. Water container(s) in area with cap(s) on.
7. Cooking kits clean and properly stored.
8. Fire safety: fire extinguisher or water/sand containers in cooking area.
9. Campsite, in general, is organized.
10. Campsite, in general, is clean.
11. Cooking area is appropriate for the "lay of the land."
12. Trash bag(s) is/are visible and being used.
13. Individual equipment is neatly stowed/secured.
14. Backpacks and/or patrol boxes are neatly stowed/secured.
15. Kitchen area is clean.

Notes:

- ◆ If the patrol name is not **posted** in plain sight, they may receive a **"0"** for the inspection because we don't know who we are inspecting.
- ◆ If cooking is done at the troop level, not by the individual patrols, each patrol in the troop will receive a **"0"** for inspection items #3, 4, 11, 15.
